INFORMATION FOR PARTICIPANTS

The 4th Meeting of the AEWA European Goose Management International Working Group (EGM IWG4) will be held at the Battleby Conference Centre in Perth, Scotland, United Kingdom on 18 to 20 June 2019.

Back-to-back with the EGM IWG4 meeting, a face-to-face meeting of the EGMP Task Forces will be held on 17 June 2019 in the same venue.

Meeting Dates

The EGM IWG4 meeting will be opened at 09:00 on Tuesday 18 June and is scheduled to finish after lunch (13:00) on Thursday 20 June. Times are subject to change, to be communicated on the [website](#) if applicable.

Battleby Conference Centre 18-20 June

The registration desk will be in the Conference Centre entrance hall. The meeting will be held in the auditorium on the ground floor, and you will be directed from the registration desk.

Some short Information about Perth


Perth is a beautiful and historic city on the banks of the River Tay. As Scotland's newest city, Perth offers visitors fantastic live music, exciting events, dozens of independent shops and many award-winning eateries.

Perth is ideally placed to access the outdoors, as it's surrounded by hills and mountains that are popular with walkers, mountain-bikers and photographers.

As Scotland's ancient capital, Perthshire is steeped in history and heritage. From the Soldier's Leap in the North dating back to the Jacobite Rebellion to a former World War II prisoner of war camp in Comrie, you will find many significant, [historical landmarks](#). Whether you want to see the iconic Black Watch Museum showing the history of Scotland's oldest Highland Regiment, watch the sport of kings at Perth Racecourse or visit Loch Leven Castle situated on the middle of an island in the loch itself - you can take a boat over and browse the tranquil island and explore the castle where Mary Queen of Scots was once imprisoned. 
You can also visit the Highland Chocolatier, an award winning truffle specialist or see how single malt whisky is made at the oldest working distillery in Scotland, the Glenturret Distillery (Information on [food and drink attractions](#)).

A few minutes north of Perth, just off the A9, is (Scottish Natural Heritage) Battleby Conference Centre, the venue for the conference. The conference facilities available are enhanced by 37 acres of woodland, wildflower meadows and pathways accessible for all.

The venue is also very “green” with heating provided by renewable energy, food waste composted, recycling points and cycle parking. Battleby Conference Centre also holds a Green Tourism silver award.

Travel and Transport to and from Perth and the Conference Centre

Travel will be to Edinburgh Airport (<https://www.edinburghairport.com>) or Glasgow Airport (<https://www.glasgowairport.com>) and onwards to Perth by train (ca. 2-2.5 hours from either airport depending on connection).

Transport to and from Perth to the Battleby Conference Centre will be provided in the mornings and evenings after the end of the conference with pick-up and drop-off locations in Perth. More information on the free shuttle will be provided at a later stage.

Perth is relatively small and much of it can be explored on foot. [Buses](#) are however available. Tickets can be purchased in the bus.

Meals

Lunches will be provided for all participants on all meeting days (17 June for TF meeting participants and 18-20 June for participants to the EGM IWG4). Lunch will be served in the venue.

Coffee and tea will be available from 08:30 onwards and there will also be refreshments in the morning and afternoon during coffee breaks for all meeting days.

An event, kindly hosted by Scottish Natural Heritage, will be offered on Tuesday, 18 June, after the meeting.

Visas

All registered participants requiring visas will be provided with personal invitation letters as well as verbal notes to support their visa applications.
