

New initiatives suggested by task force members at the meeting in Tromsø 17 June 2024.

(I) The coming online meetings in the task force will (as an earlier meeting) include <u>extended presentations</u> by task force members (round the table). This will give the opportunities to present new activities, projects and share other relevant information. Such exchange is especially useful as the task force consists of a combination of scientists, managers and stakeholders from many Range States. <u>Extended notes</u> after the meeting will provide information also for members not able to attend the meetings.

(II) We will arrange the <u>webinar</u> as planned in August with presentations about various relevant themes for the task force. We will announce this later this summer.

(III) An <u>Agriculture Task Force Fact Sheet</u> will be developed, also including some relevant information (short) from the various Range States. Task force members from the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences/Wildlife Damage Centre will make a draft and thereafter receive input from task force members.

- (IV) Although the task force has members representing <u>farmers</u>' interest (Copa <u>Cogeca</u>, Norwegian Farmers' Union) it was pointed out that we need to <u>involve their perspectives more</u> in the task force. As the Wadden Sea Forum do not exist any longer, it was also discussed how a former member could be included in the task force. Two suggestions were identified for a better involvement of agriculture perspectives:
 - Explore the possibilities to include more task force members representing farmers' interest.
 - b. Arrange a <u>webinar</u> during the winter 2024/2025 with research projects demonstrating where <u>farmers have been actively involved, either as project partners and/or initiators.</u> The format will be popular, and presentations are aimed for a wide audience.
