

Taiga Bean Goose ISSAP

- 2012: Listed in Category 3c* of Column A
 - Need for an ISSAP and Adaptive Harvest Management of this important quarry population
- 2012-2015: Preparation of the draft ISSAP

Drafting group

- 2015: ISSAP Adopted by AEWA MOP6
 - \succ Implementation through the AEWA EGMP since 2016 \rightarrow
- AEWA Action and management plans have, in general, a 10-year live span and options are:
 - Extension (Update), Revision or Retirement




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Taiga Bean Goose complex

- ISSAP: Taiga Bean Goose (Anser fabalis fabalis), North-east Europe/North-west Europe
 - Category 3c* of Column A
 - 4 Management Units
- Based on increased knowledge the Management units would satisfy the <u>requirements of separate flyway populations</u>

• criteria established by the AEWA Technical Committee and approved by the Contracting Parties (2005, 2016).



Status in terms of ISSAP implementation (AHM)


- Western MU moratorium
- Central MU AHM
- Eastern 1&2 moratorium



AEWA MOP8 changed the population delineations of the TBG

From MU's to populations and from 3c* to xx

- Western MU → Scandinavia/Denmark and UK
 - Category 1c in Column A
- Central MU → Finland and NW Russia/Sweden,
 Denmark and Germany
 - Category 3c* of Column A
- Eastern 1 → West Siberia/Poland and Germany
 - Category 2 of Column A
- Eastern 2: This management unit is currently recognised as the *johanseni* subspecies of Bean Goose




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FUTURE OF THE ISSAP

- The change on the flyway populations of the Bean Goose have following implications to the ISSAP
 - Conseptual changes to the structure of the ISSAP need to adjust objectives and actions to meet the new structure
 - On practical level the implementation foreseen to more or less status quo – improvement always welcome!
 - →A need for a revision of the plan for AEWA MOP9 at 2025




Evaluation and review process

• The evaluation work has been started in the Task Force

- Preparation of a questionnaire for the data collection for the evaluation and review
- Questionnaire is based on the structure of the Action Framework
 - Challenge: How to measure the level of implementation?
 - How to formulate questions in such a format, that replies of the Range States can be compiled and analysed?

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- Future work
 - Summer/Early Autumn
 - Further work on the questionnaire & finalization within the TF
 - Autumn
 - Questionnaire to Range States
 - Preparation and resoursing for the next steps
 - Winter
 - Evaluation → recommendations for the next steps
 - Revision and consultation 2024-2025
